### **Is this course right for me?**

If you want to pursue a higher education qualification in nursing, mental health nursing, midwifery, children's nursing, physiotherapy, paramedical science, as an operating department practitioner or in another health-related subject but lack the necessary qualifications our Access to Higher Education Diploma (Health Professions) will give you the skills you need to go on to your dream career.

## Entry Requirements

To access this course you are required to:

- Have English at Level 2 (eg GCSE grade 4/C or above / equivalent Functional Skills qualification depending on individual university requirements)
- Have maths at Level 2 (eg GCSE grade 4/C or above / equivalent Functional Skills qualification depending on individual university requirements)\*
- Show commitment to the course and be motivated and determined to be successful on this intensive programme of study.
- Access to Higher Education courses are designed for adults, therefore all applicants will need to be aged 19 or over by the time the course starts.

*\*Applicants without this level of qualification will be required to complete a diagnostic assessment to determine their level of maths skills and knowledge and, if necessary, study for the Level 2 qualification alongside the Access course.*

### **Please note:**

- Students who are contemplating studying for a degree in one of the healthcare professions will need to ensure that they have sufficient paid or unpaid work experience to satisfy university entry requirements
- When applying to university a DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) check will be necessary
