How long is the course?

The course is five days a week and, depending on your progress, lasts for between five and six weeks.

Where is the training held?

All courses are held at the college's dedicated construction site on the Wellington Road campus, in Bilston.

This course is part of the college's Into Employment programme funded by <u>West Midlands</u> <u>Combined Authority</u> to equip local people with the skills needed to work in priority sectors across the region and support employers who are looking to recruit new staff.

- CPCS (Construction Plant Competence Scheme) industry recognition of your plant operating skills
- CSCS (Construction Skills Certification Scheme) proof that you have the appropriate training and qualifications to work on a construction site
